### 3 Property and Building

We have a maintenance plan that has identified the work that needs to be addressed over the next 10 years. This will be reviewed each year, and priorities re-established as needs require. Thanks very much to Kevin Walker and Bridget for their work on this over the last couple of years.

This year, after some early discussion, the main priority was the kitchen upgrade. The old ovens and stove top needed repairs but some of the parts were not available. Consequently, new ovens and stove top were replaced.

I think you would all agree that it looks good, clean and sharp. It is now a much more attractive proposition for hiring out, as well as for catering for our own tournaments etc.

The ladies toilets also had a spruce up with a new coat of paint.

This coming financial year the main priorities are:

- Replace and upgrade the old switchboard
- Replace the heating units in the Pipitea room and painting where applicable.
- Replace the ceiling tiles in the Pipitea room

The maintenance spend is budgeted to be an average of \$27,000 per annum.

## Treasurer's Report 2016

It is with pleasure that I present the Club's financial report for 2015-2016.

The Club made a loss of \$7,024. We were budgeting for a surplus of \$1,272. The main reason for this loss is that we spent a lot more on repairs and maintenance than we originally budgeted for. At the time when the budget was completed the kitchen upgrade had not been approved. In the end we went ahead with the upgrade, and this was the reason for the large repairs expenditure. Thanks to the generosity of the members we raised just over \$4,000 towards the cost of the upgrade.

We expect to spend an average of \$27,000pa over the next ten years on maintaining the condition of our asset. Last year we spent \$17,886 finishing off the exterior painting, plus \$24,362 on the kitchen refurbishment. On top of that we spent \$9,545 on capital assets for the kitchen which is reflected in the Statement of Financial Position as part of fixed assets.

Looking at the Statement of Financial Position, the amount of money in the bank was \$151,588 compared to the same period last year when it was \$130,658. However note that our accounts payable as at balance date was \$34,142 (2015:\$6,053).

Next year we are again budgeting for a small surplus.

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year to 31 July 2016

#### **Note 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The Club is an Incorporated Society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. The Financial Statements have been prepared according to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

The Club is entitled to use differential reporting exemptions because it is not publicly accountable and it is not large. The Club has applied all differential reporting exemptions.

The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost. Reliance is placed on the fact that the Club is a going concern. All income and expenditure is brought to account on an accrual basis.

#### **PARTICULAR ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Stock on Hand** – Alcohol stocks are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value

**Fixed Assets** – Assets are stated at cost and depreciated over their estimated economic life using the following rates:

Buildings	100 years (1%) straight line
Furniture and Fittings	10 years (25%) diminishing value
Computer, Printer and Other Office Equipment	3 years (25-33%) diminishing value

**GST** – The Club is a "GST Registered Person" and these accounts are prepared on a GST exclusive basis, so that GST is not included in any account other than as a receivable or payable in the Statement of Financial Position.


