# Newly published books in our Bridge Club Library

#### Card play

Whether you are a beginner or have played for some time, your understanding of the basic techniques of card play is essential for your success.

In a new series, two of the game's top writers David Bird and Marc Smith explain clearly the various card play skills that you will need. Every booklet contains six chapters – each ending with a short quiz. Topics include drawing trumps, discarding losers and finessing.

This is our clubs annual tournament for junior and intermediate players. This competition is played as two separate tournaments. We do get a number of pairs entering from other clubs so let's get lots of entries to increase our chances of taking home the major prizes.

players are encouraged to participate as the only systems are those which can be used in junior tournaments (unless otherwise agreed by both pairs without coercion).
