Presidents Corner... Brad Tattersfield

Hi everyone

I'd like to start my first column by thanking my predecessor, Mindy Wu, for the excellent job she did last year. It's great to have her back on the committee, along with returning members and our new members Karl Hayes, Susan Laurenson and Simon Louisson.

It's been an unsettling time lately with world events and, of course, the earthquake here. Fortunately our clubrooms have escaped damage, apart from the Pipitea room clock falling off the wall and its glass cover breaking.

It has also been a turbulent time at NZ Bridge, our national organisation. I wasn't at our recent AGM, but I know that the proposals to restructure NZ Bridge caused considerable debate, prompted by an open letter from Treasurer Alan Turner complaining about the process NZ Bridge has followed.

There was a proposal at the AGM for the club to call a special meeting to discuss the restructuring. The committee appreciates the concerns that many members have about this, and we will convene a special meeting soon. But before that, we want to give NZ Bridge the chance to remedy what has been, to date, a failure of communication on its part.

On behalf of the committee, I've written to NZ Bridge today asking for a clear, transparent statement of the thinking behind the proposed restructuring. This has been singularly lacking. NZ Bridge's statements to date have been opaque and high-level, with little justification beyond the principle of splitting governance and management.

NZ Bridge argues that legal issues around the need to consult with potentially affected staff prevent it from commenting further. We disagree. It is standard corporate practice to clearly and openly state the principles and rationale behind any organisational restructuring intentions before consulting with employees.

Last night we discussed the situation with Allan Joseph, who is a NZ Bridge board member. I can tell you that we “gave him a grilling” though we really appreciated his willingness to meet with us and debate the issues – as one committee member put it, he was among friends! Allan explained that the broad aim of the restructuring was to allow the board to concentrate on governance, freeing up paid and volunteer staff to concentrate more of their efforts on the business of growing the game.

However, we remain unclear as to how the proposed restructuring will achieve that. We have asked that NZ Bridge provide this rationale, and allow clubs to comment, before final decisions are taken. This echoes requests made by other clubs and by the Wellington Regional Committee.

I'll keep you posted on this.
